

HOW TO USE THE TAR COMMAND IN LINUX

A GRAPHICAL EXPLANATION

To create an archive:

`tar -czvf NameOfArchive.tar.gz /PathToFolder/FolderOrFileName`

archive

"z":
once the
archive
is
created,
compress

gzip

"v":
create a
verbose
output
as the
command
is
running

"f":
allows
user to
name
archive

Name of
the
archived
file:
Be sure
to end
it with
"tar.gz"
to mark
it as a
gizpped
archive

Folder or file to be placed in archive:
Be sure to type the correct path to the
folder and folder name.
If the folder is in the same directory
as you are in you do not need to type
the path.

To extract an archive:

`tar -xzvf NameOfArchive.tar.gz`

unzip
the
archive
using
gzip

"v":
create a
verbose

"f":
user can
tell tar
what the
filename
is

to be extracted:
Be sure to end it with
"tar.gz" so that tar will
